  - Primary Reading (Professional Literacy Cohorts)
  - Math/Science Resource Cohorts (Intermediate)
  - Secondary Math Dinner Series

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- Other Initiatives:
  - Leadership for Innovative Teaching and Learning (Raj Dhasi)
  - Google Read&Write
  - Assessment for Learning (3 year focus)
  - 180 Days of Learning
  - ADST Pilot

BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORT

Trustee Windsor reported on the following events and committee meeting she recently attended:

- BCSTA Provincial Council meeting on February 17 & 18, which included BCSTA's Sector Leaders Speaker Series (similar to Delta's Ignite), and the passing of motions to increase BCSTA member fees, and receipt of the 2017/2018 Draft Budgets (which has a slight increase of 1.2% added for Delta which equals \$530 (the budget will go to the AGM first)). The following 4 Motions to Provincial Council were also passed: 1) Fraser Valley Branch Constitution and Bylaws 2) Funding of Direct and Indirect Costs Arising from Supreme Court of Canada Decision 3) Recruitment and Retention in Northern Districts 4) Syrian Refugee Funding.
- Battle of the Badges at Sungod Arena in support of anti-bullying campaigns on Pink Shirt Day, also attended by Chairperson Dixon and Senior Staff. It was a very well-run hockey game. All of the players treated each other with respect, the students were great, and the anti-bullying message got across.
- District Science Fair at Scottsdale Mall on March 2nd.

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Trustee Kanakos reported on the following events and committee meeting he recently attended:

- BC Public School Employers' Association AGM, where contract issues were briefly discussed. The AGM was also attended by Mr. Allnutt.
- District Emergency Preparedness Committee meeting – It is good to know the district is in good hands if an emergency was to occur.
- Delta Secondary's Girls Basketball – Trustee Kanakos watched some really good games (including versus North Delta Secondary), and is impressed with the quality of basketball. He would like to thank the coaches and staff members for helping Delta's students develop socially and physically.

Chairperson Dixon reported on the following events and committee meetings she recently attended:

- DPAC – Two meetings the first with Trustees & Senior Staff in January and second meeting on school district Budgeting, and perhaps not surprisingly, considerable discussion about recent winter conditions and operations in the District.
- Liaison Committee – The Corporation of Delta's Parks and Rec Department introduced Reg Wilford, the new Manager of Culture and Museum Services, and the committee discussed how the Corporation of Delta and the Delta School District can work together on the new service delivery model which will see displays at many different sites throughout Delta.
- Alternate Education Review – Thank you to staff who put together a half day symposium with students about Delta's Alternate Education Programs. The students were very engaged and Chairperson Dixon appreciated the time they took to speak with Trustees. Their ideas and suggestions will make a difference
- Metro Branch of BCSTA Meeting – There was unanimous support from Member Metro Districts to support Val Windsor's Notice of Motion: THAT BCSTA encourage the Ministry of Education to continue funding the Teacher mentorship programme presently jointly sponsored by Ministry of Education, BCSTA, BCSSA and BCTF. This motion will be a resolution at the BCSTA's Spring AGM.
- North Delta Secondary School's Flash Mob – Thank you to staff, community member Sean Bindra, and BC Lion Travis Lulay, who came out with 1,000 students for a flash mob in support of anti-bullying on February 21<sup>st</sup>. It was a very fun way to demonstrate Delta students' commitment to keep their schools safe, inclusive, and a welcoming place to learn for all.
- Battle of the Badges - Pink shirt day in Delta had many events throughout schools but the largest was Battle of the Badges. Thank you to the organizing committee from the Police Foundation, the Delta School District, the Delta Firefighters Charitable Society and the Parks and Recreation Department who hosted well over a 1,000 students from across the District to a hockey game at Sungod Arena between the Delta Firefighters and Delta Police. Great leadership from some of Delta's community heroes reminding students to #CHOOSEKINDNESS.
- Thank you to North Delta Rotary who held a fundraiser this past weekend with proceeds to benefit the Starfish Backpack Program which is now operating in a number of Delta Schools. Your caring and support of Delta students is very much appreciated.

In accordance with Administrative Procedure 260, the Board is advised of the following multiple-day field trips:

**Seaquam Secondary:** Approximately 41 band and choir students in Grades 9-12 will travel by bus to Seattle and Portland from March 30–April 1, 2017. The students' musical experiences will be enriched through workshops, live performances, and a museum visit.
